1 Corinthians 15:45 speaks about the first and second Adam. The first Adam failed and brought corruption into the world. The second Adam, Jesus Christ, is the Savior who brings redemption and restoration.

Jesus' Bold Statements

- John 10:24-38: The Pharisees questioned Jesus about his claims, and Jesus responded by saying that He and the Father are one.
- The Pharisees and the scribes did not believe in Jesus as the Messiah.
- For them they studied the Torah all their life, they thought they knew everything about the scriptures.
- It's good to know everything about scripture, but some people haven't seen the Spirit of God speak into the spirit of man.
- Jesus' statements were seen as blasphemous by the Pharisees, but Jesus was simply expressing His unity with the Father.

The Story of Saul

- When Saul was on his way to Damascus, he was struck by a light. After that, he testified that the people who were with him saw the light but didn't hear the voice. Paul heard the voice, and he saw the light.

The Story of Lazarus

- Jesus received a message that Lazarus was sick, and He responded by saying that the sickness was not unto death.
- Jesus waited for two days before going to Bethany, and when He arrived, He raised Lazarus from the dead.
- The story highlights Jesus' unity with the Father and His ability to hear and respond to the Father's voice.

Walk in the Light

- In John 11 verse 9, when Jesus said, *"If any man walk in the day, he stumbleth not, because he seeth the light of this world. But if a man walk in the night, he stumbleth, because there is no light in him"*. The Lord Jesus was not speaking about the daylight or anything that can make us stumble on the road but was speaking about spiritual guidance. It's the light that the Lord is producing inside a person's life.

- “*If a man walks in the night, he stumbles*” - what does that mean? In the night really means if you walk without spiritual revelation about what you're going to do in the near future, then you are not walking in the light. You are walking at night; it's a condition of lack of revelation, or lack of inspiration.
- For us to do the will of the Father we need to have the light of God in us, in the day we're living
- We cannot copy, repeat or even experience the days of Moses or the prophets and so on because the days have already gone. These steps are the instructions to teach us how to look up to the Father for further directions in the time we are living in.
- If you don't have the light, stay at peace and wait upon the Lord, “*they that wait upon the Lord will renew their strength and will mount up with winds as eagles*” (Isa.40:1).
- When you have a calling inside and the Spirit starts to speak inside you, God has installed that Spirit inside you so that He can communicate to you and me.

The Importance of Spiritual Revelation

- Jesus' ability to hear and respond to the Father's voice was a key aspect of His ministry.
- We too need to have spiritual revelation and hear from God in order to fulfill our calling and purpose.

The Accusation of Blasphemy

- The Pharisees accused Jesus of making himself God, but Jesus responded by saying that He was simply expressing his unity with the Father.
- Jesus quoted Psalm 82:6, which says “*I say, 'You are gods'*” to emphasize that He was not making himself God, but rather expressing His divine nature.

Conclusion

You have a calling upon your life and you need the Spirit of God to guide you in that calling. God has put spiritual gifts in us. The Spirit He puts in us is for him to communicate to us. We need to have spiritual revelation and hear from God in order to fulfil our calling and purpose.
